We therefore welcome scientific and academic papers that focus on this multidisciplinary area. The first International Workshop on Cryptology and Network Security was in Taipei, Taiwan, 2001. The second one was in San Francisco, California, USA, September 26 - 28, 2002, the third in Miami, Florida, USA, September 24 - 26, 2003, the fourth in Xiamen, Fujian, China, December 14-16, 2005 and the fifth in Suzhou, Jiangsu, China, December 8 - 10, 2006.

Instructions for Authors:

Papers on cryptology are welcome. Those that make a substantial link with network security will be given priority. Authors of such paper are encouraged to explain in a subsection of the introduction the link with network security. Quality papers on pure cryptology may also be accepted.

Submissions must not substantially duplicate work that any of the authors has published elsewhere or has submitted in parallel for consideration of any other journal, conference/workshop with proceedings. Submissions should have at most 12 pages excluding the bibliography and appendices, and at most 20 pages in total, using at least 11-point fonts and with reasonable margins. All submissions should be anonymous. Authors of accepted papers must guarantee that at least one of the authors will attend the conference and present their paper.

The proceedings is planned to be published in the Lecture Notes in Computer Science series by Springer Verlag, and be available at the conference.
